


Media usage by age












Benefits of Technology

























Built-in Parental Controls on Devices

Both Android and iOS have built-in parental control features utilizing tools such as Google's Family Link or a Shared Account on iOS.



A few clicks using the Parson app on a parent's phone enables:



Time lock

Time Lock can be used to prevent your child from using their device by blocking access to things like apps, games, and web browsers.



App lock

Apps Lock feature allows parents to manage apps according to SHOW / HIDE the apps.



Schedule

Free Time Allowance is a default feature letting you set a daily free time limit for your children to manage independently, during permitted times. OnceAllowance time expires, the device will default into a blocked state.



Web Block

"Parental Control Service Web Block" blocks harmful or inappropriate sites



Location

Parental Control Locator allows you to view your children's device locations anytime, anywhere.




Control

Parental Control gives you the right to turn ON / OFF the target device's features.

Roblox: Social Gaming and Safety Features





Roblox offers users the ability to socialize and play experiences with others. Parents can set up controls to limit chat and access to certain games.

Minecraft can be incredibly creative and educational. However, playing on public online servers can expose children to inappropriate content or interactions.

- Age-Appropriate Content: Curated videos filtered for different age groups (4 & under, 5-8, 9-12).
- Strong Parental Controls:Set screen time limits.

- Limited Advertising











Snapchat Family Centre Features




Snapchat's Family Centre provides parental supervision features, allowing parents to see their teen's friends and manage content visibility.



Setting Rules and Boundaries


Setting clear rules and boundaries is essential.

- Guidelines:
 - This might include time limits, tech-free zones in the house, and discussions about what information is safe to share online.
 - Involve your child in setting these rules where appropriate.
 - Be consistent in enforcing them.





Importance of Ongoing Communication



Technology is constantly evolving, so ongoing communication is crucial.

Key Points:

- Talk about how to be safe online and make sure children are aware of why and how. Don't share personal information, don't randomly click or open attachments, how to close pop ups.
- Make sure your child knows they can come to you with any concerns, no matter how small.
- Have regular conversations about their online activities. Ask open-ended questions, and most importantly, listen without judgment.

When Should I Talk To Them?

There is no right time, to talk about online safety, it should be an ongoing conversation

- After school
- Bathtime
- Car journeys this can be a great time to talk, and your child will have plenty of time to as questions if they need.
- Reading
- Playing A Game/Watching a video -
- Swimming a great time to say that what's covered by swimwear is private.
- Watching TV together when something comes up.

Protect Your Stuff	Learning how to keep information secure online and create strong passwords
Respect Each Other	Understanding what it means to be kind online and respect other people's privacy
When in Doubt, Discuss	Asking for help from a parent or trusted adult with tricky situations online



Balancing Screen Time


It's not just about online safety; it's also about the amount of time children spend online, both in your presence and alone.

interactive screen time Under an 1 hour hour per day




