Our behaviour system is changing a little since last year - we aim to really highlight the positives.

Handwriting

We are teaching the children to write in print rather than cursive.

• We concentrate on forming letters correctly with lead in lines and will still be doing lots of fine motor activities with threading and playdough etc.



- In the summer term the children will take part in a phonics screening test.
- This is a government appointed test and has to be completed by all year 1 children in the country.
- The test involves reading 40 words. 20 words are real and 20 words will be nonsense words. Children have to apply their phonics and blending skills.
- We will be building up to this task over the year. We do not teach to the test. The children do receive daily phonics teaching.
 - We will be offering a more in depth information closer to the time of the test.

Our topics

- Do all heroes wear capes?
 - Do you need wings to fly?
- Does chocolate grow on trees?
 - What's in the wild?
 - Who lives in castles?
 - Is it real or is it fantasy?

We are yet to decide the location for our school trip - watch this space!

Parent involvement

- We encourage you to read 3+ times a week with your child to help develop a love for reading. This doesn't always have to be a formal sit down and read a book play a word games with cars/read a shopping list etc
- We will send home our RWI reading scheme books once all assessments have been completed (we have started already).

 Ask your child about their day, believe it or not, we do do a lot!

Weekly in Year 1

- PE will be taught on Mondays and Fridays we will still be using the outside spaces so please use your judgement to dress your child appropriately.
- Earrings we do ask that you remove these where possible, or send in tape to cover them.
- We are super lucky to have Forest School time this term! Please ensure the correct clothing is sent into school - there is long grass and lots of mud!

Weekly in Year 1

- We will be introducing library sessions the children choose their own book to take home and will then change it every Thursday.
- We have changed the way we are sending books home these will now be RWI books (to match our phonics). Your child will have read them in school and will then bring them home to be able to 'show off' and apply what has been covered in their group over that week!

How you can help

- Work with us by sharing your concerns and aspirations for your child we want to unite and achieve the best possible outcomes for the children.
- Encourage independence and resilience at home.
 - Encourage your child to have a sense of responsibility for bringing (and returning) a book bag and water bottle to school.
- Ensuring all items are labelled to further support independence and to help us reunite items of clothing with their owners.

Continuous Provision

We know and understand the importance of learning through play and will be continuing this learning style throughout your child's Year 1 journey.

There will be provision set up both inside and outside the classroom for your children to become individual learners and investigate, develop and show off their learning in their own way, with their own flare!
